The Level 4 VRQ Certificate in Electrical Safety Management in Social Housing has been designed for management in social housing who have responsibility for the safety of electrical appliances and installations in their tenants' properties. It builds an understanding of electrical dangers, landlord responsibilities and legislation, in particular the Electricity at Work Regulations, IET Wiring Regulations and the Health & Safety at Work Act.

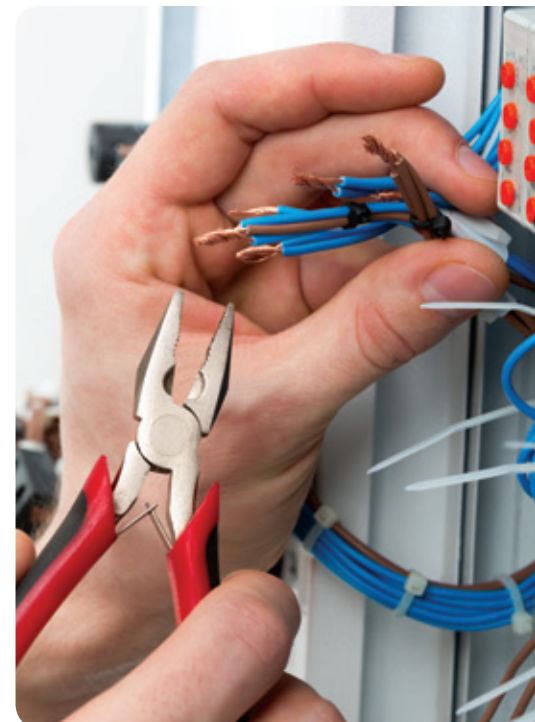
Who is the qualification for?

The qualification is for anyone in Social Housing responsible for electrical safety management, including those who may not have an electrical background or technical qualification, but need to have a good understanding of electrical issues. These roles might include Asset Manager, Mechanical & Electrical Manager, FM Manager, Contract Manager, Cyclical Works Manager, Compliance Manager, Technical Safety Officer/Manager or people wishing to progress their careers.

The Level 4 VRQ Certificate in Electrical Safety Management in Social Housing is a one day guided learning event taken by experienced tutors, followed by self-study modules and the development of a portfolio. The qualification can be completed at your own pace, normally within twelve months.

The qualification consists of five units:

- **Statutory and Non-Statutory Requirements**
To achieve a good appreciation of statutory and non-statutory requirements relevant to electrical equipment, installations and maintenance
- **Understanding Circuits, Definitions, Installation Methods and Classification Types**
Encompasses the knowledge required to reduce the possibility of electrical shocks
- **Procedure for the In-Service Inspection and Testing of Electrical Equipment**
An understanding of the principles and reasons for the in-house inspection and testing of electrical installations and equipment
- **Managing Electrics in Social Housing**
An understanding of the requirements of a manager who is responsible for managing electrical operatives in the field
- **Electrical Safety and Responsibilities**
Covers the responsibilities a manager might encounter to ensure electrical safety is not compromised
